Putin signs mass media ownership bill and its impact on New Life Radio





DATELINE: November 7, 1996

From a small studio on a hilltop overlooking the port of Magadan, a region where millions of Soviet citizens were imprisoned and killed--many for their faith in Christ--an FM transmitter was turned on and the voice of NEW LIFE in Christ ushered in a new era of Christian evangelism for a country that had prevented the name of JESUS from being broadcast over the airwaves.

The mission strategy was simple: find a means to develop Christian radio where there wasn't any, in order to support the growing Slavic church in evangelism and discipleship. The key was to start in one place, and expand it nationwide. Starting with the first Christian FM station in Russia to an international satellite radio network, this is the history of NEW LIFE RADIO, and we celebrate its 18th anniversary in sharing the light of the Gospel!

Putin Signs Law Curbing Foreign Ownership of Russian Media: the impact on NLR

MOSCOW, October 15, 2014 (RIA Novosti News) –

"Russian President Vladimir Putin has signed a law reducing the possible share of foreign stockholders in the Russian media to 20 percent. Federal sources quoted, "Unless otherwise stipulated by an international treaty ... a Russian legal entity with a foreign participation share amounting more than to 20 percent ... has no right to own, manage or control... more than 20 percent of shares of the authorized capital of the entity." In addition, the new law stipulates that foreign citizens, stateless persons and citizens of the Russian Federation who have citizenship of another country, are not entitled to act as founders of media companies. Permitting foreigners to control mass media could influence the strategic decision-making process and, in some cases, this could threaten the informational security of the state, as well as the rights and liberties of Russian citizens, member of the Russian Federation Council Andrei Klishas told RIA Novosti in late September."

WITH THE PASSING OF THIS LAW, the current non-commercial partnership organization in Moscow that controls New Life Radio (since 2004) will be liquidated in February 2017. NLR founder Daniel Johnson--who also serves as president of *Christian Radio for Russia*--was disqualified by this new law to continue the radio organization. Efforts were made to seek compliance with the legislation to end his trusteeship of NLR and establish 100% Russian control, however, Russian federal regulations make no provision for the transferring of ownership of this type of legal entity to others. In essence, NLR is faced with one prospect: create a new non-profit in Moscow and pursue the required legal permissions to engage in mass media and broadcasting, or terminate in-country broadcasts by 2017.

As part of its contingency planning, CRFR is able at any time to initiate and sustain the satellite radio network from a site outside of Russia. Steps are now being taken in Moscow to develop a new entity that will take over the legal sponsorship of New Life Radio. Station manager Dima Vatoulya is leading the effort to register a new mass media organization, in conjunction with local representatives of Christian ministries that have partnered with NLR since its inception of satellite radio broadcasting. While there are no guarantees that the new organization will be able to secure all mass media permissions, we have two years to prepare, while NLR continues in its current state through February 2017.

The new law also affects our FM radio affiliates that will now be required

to change their mass media licenses in order to use the programming from the new entity. There are many bureaucratic barriers to get through in order to reassemble the current network, as well as a new mass media name for NLR, which may simply have its identification shorted to an acronym like **Radio NL** (New Life).

Please pray that God, in His wisdom, will show us the way through this process, even as Russia continues its repression of basic freedoms of religion and the press. While NLR has weathered many storms throughout its ministry life, we know this is just one more event to keep us on our knees in prayer and dependence on the Lord, so that we might accomplish His purpose to proclaim the Gospel across the Slavic world.

In October, Dima Vatoulya finished construction of a remote-controlled radio automation system, filled with 14 years of programming, that will be sent to CRFR in New York to serve as a system backup to our satellite radio network. With this equipment, we can guarantee NLR's operations no matter what happens in Moscow.

NLR STAFF UPDATE continued:

The dedicated team of radio missionaries at NLR are facing great personal financial needs as the cost of living in Moscow has risen dramatically, due to Putin's decree to stop all food imports from western nations that have set sanctions on the Russian state. Food costs are very high, and we are concerned to be able to take decent care of our staff. They are hardworking despite being underpaid, because they have a clear calling from God to continue no matter what the situation. Still, they have 5 children and we need to do our part to equip these missionaries.

CRFR has set a goal of increasing the compensation of each staff person by \$500 a month, while also seeking to make Andre Mironov full time at the station (monthly cost: \$1700). If you can help sponsor an individual staff missionary above and beyond what they current receive, CRFR would be grateful.

A THOUGHT: There is little we can do about all the pressures and troubles facing New Life Radio from the actions of the Russian government, and we are prepared to take on any and all challenges they give us that threaten our radio ministry, but it would be a shame to see NLR fall, simply because we cannot raise the funds needed to keep this extremely effective global media ministry working. NOW MORE THAN EVER, we need your prayers and financial support!

NEW LIFE RADIO continues its tradition of sponsoring the costs of programming for the Slavic church, having NO paid programs (save for one), NO selling of products or services on the air, and NO ongoing solicitations for support. We call it MIRACLE RADIO, because few stations would survive for so long under these conditions. Thank you for your part to keep us broadcasting!



Our satellite broadcasts via *Hotbird* cover Europe and Russia to the Ural Mountains. Beyond that, there is no signal available to provide Christian encouragement to scattered communities in Russia and other republics, with only 1 local Christian FM station in that area of 5 time zones! CRFR has an offer from an Israeli telecom company near Tel Aviv to access the *Yamal* satellite in order to give us true nationwide coverage of Russia. With 99% of Russian cities without a local Christian radio station, the need is truly great, and as Russians regularly use direct to home satellite as their way to get programming, it is easy for them to hear NLR as it appears as a free channel on their satellite receivers.
