NEW LIFE RADIO (NLR): carrying on the call to Mission, even when the power is cut...

272 days of war and the day before Thanksgiving...

At 7:50 am, Ivan Zhurakovski, NLR's station manager calls from Budapest Hungary to Daniel Johnson in Pennsylvania informing him that the entire city of Odessa is out of electrical power. The Russian military has just hit a critical power distribution line near Kiev, shutting down the power grid connections to Odessa and the city is dark. NLR's emergency generator automatically kicks on and there is power in the main studio to do a few hours of broadcasting before the gasoline runs out. NLR engineer Yuri Ignatenko wants to finish the listener song request and greeting hour before turning off the generator and transferring over the radio network control to Ivan in Budapest to maintain our 24/7 transmissions. As the generator quits, Yuri covered up equipment, prayed, then sang out the hymn *Who is like our God*, went to sleep, and the lights came back on!

People in Odessa are panicking--as in numerous cities across Ukraine-and many think only of survival as winter approaches with no light, heat, or water. These are the circumstances of life that New Life Radio is ministering in, and our team has the challenge of encouraging them to trust their very lives to the Lord of the Universe who can take care of their every need. Only He can give hope in the midst of death and destruction.

Not knowing how long this crisis will continue, no matter what happens, we seek God's protection and provision to continue carrying out our work to proclaim Christ and His Kingdom to nations at war. While it is tough for Ukrainians to consider something like a *Thanksgiving* holiday at the moment, all of us at CRFR and NLR are thanking the Lord that we can continue on our work from the safety of Budapest and keep the broad-casts continuing over our satellite and Internet networks. We can only pray that the power stays on and the Lord ends this conflict in His perfect will and timing.



From Odessa to lasi to Budapest

In December 2021, NLR made contingency plans to relocate our network facility just in case Russia did the unexpected and actually sent their troops into Ukraine. Manager Ivan was willing to uproot his family to go wherever required, and we have watched the Lord take care of him and us as he quickly moved our radio gear across the border, first to Moldova, then Romania and now Hungary. Nove Zhittya: A progress report

Despite the challenges of the war, CRFR continues to work with our radio staff and the wider Christian community in both Ukraine and the USA to develop our newest programming venture called *Radio Nove Zhittya* (*New Life Radio* in Ukrainian).

One of the consequences of this conflict is the growing rejection of the Russian language by Ukrainians, coupled with the new state law against use of Russian in radio broadcasting throughout Ukraine. If NLR is to minister effectively to audiences throughout the country in the future, it must be done on the basis of Ukrainian. At the same time, we will continue our outreach to Russia, Belarus, and to Russian-speaking countries and individuals globally.

So where do things stand today? RNZ is available to listen to on the Internet at www. **novezhitya.net** with a 24/7 automated radio schedule. It is not live radio, but music with a few teaching programs and audio Bible readings. It is a seed waiting to develop! We do not yet have a program manager for the network, as we look for the right candidate.

The NLR Russian staff spends 15% of their workday loading music and information for RNZ. We hope to have a minimum of 2 staff working on the Ukrainian station by January 2023.

CRFR is reaching out to new potential church partners in America to invest in this outreach as we seek to fund the **\$5200** per month we need to fully staff RNZ along with satellite and Internet broadcasting.

Pray that God provides all that is needed for RNZ to witness to Ukraine for Christ!
