Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, even though the earth be removed..."



Radio Nove Zhittya is now 11 months on the air and we see good progress in developing the



The Ukrainian service has a similar format to NLR's Russian channel, though we are careful not to include Russian materials at this point in *Nove Zhittya*. The war has caused a level of hostility to all things Russian, while Ukrainian government actions against the language force us to walk carefully as we program two language services to a Ukraine that speaks both. There is much uncertainty as to how this will all play out when the war ends, but NLR will reach out to people in both nations with God's

Word and proclaim the Gospel as long as He desires! Please keep our Ukrainian radio in your prayers.

In this age of technology and global telecom systems, the concern isn't so much how to get the message out, but the content of it. Even in a war, the options to broadcast are so numerous that it seems easy that NLR can now broadcast each day from studios in different countries without a hitch!

In February 2022, NLR station manager Ivan Zhurakovski left Odessa at CRFR's request, in order to guarantee our ability to keep broadcasting should the main facility get knocked out of action. Today, he finds himself in Linz, Austria working out of a home provided by a Christian couple that has plenty of room for a radio studio and space for his three children to play!

Each day, Ivan and Yuri, our Odessa coordinator, schedule the programs to switch back and forth during particular hours, including our featured *Listener Request Hour* at 4 pm Moscow time. The listener can't tell the difference and we are blessed with radio and computer gear that makes the process seamless.

But content is king in our work and NLR has been diligent in featuring the very best Bible teaching programs that address the many central doctrines of the faith. Why? People typically don't know the Bible in depth, and miss the great truths expressed. All face uncertainty and death on a daily basis, so it is natural that we focus on the plan of God from Genesis to Revelation that reveals the certainty of eternal life in heaven --while having the assurance of living in hope and joy for those with faith in Christ.

NLR continuously airs programs going deep into Revelation and focusing on what will ultimately happen to this world as it is being prepared for Christ's millennial kingdom. Teaching Eschatology and leading listeners across every chapter of Revelation reveals to many that it is truly a book that God promises to bless those who hear the words of the prophesy and keep those things which are written in it. It is often the experience in Slavic churches that this book is seldom taught, or commonly proclaimed to be too mysterious to understand. The scope of the Bible is eternal, but we are charged to teach the faith and train others to do the same, even as the Church—as forewarned by Christ—will be penetrated by our spiritual enemy who ultimately is defeated by truth.

One role of NLR's content is to train the listener to be able to identify heresy when they hear it (even from wolves in the pulpit), and that only comes from a familiarity with and mature understanding of the Scriptures. It takes study and discernment, so our daily programs canvass the Old and New Testaments with systematic and expositional Bible studies to reveal the truth God has provided for us to understand.

CRFR observations concerning Odessa

As of this writing, the war is having a big impact on our ability to increase our staff and move forward on our strategy to create new FM stations in Ukraine. There is so much uncertainty about the near future, and many people have left the city, while places we look for staff (ie., seminaries, Bible schools) are not functioning or don't have candidates to offer us. Martial law prevents relocation or makes some fearful to move to Odessa. As long as the war continues, NLR will operate on a minimal staff basis, though this does not negatively impact our programming. We seek prayer for the end of this conflict and for God in His timing to send us more called missionaries and new ministries to cooperate with. Pray for the safety of our Odessa radio team and for God to shield our station building from any incoming missiles.
