Proclaiming the Prince of Peace: the Christ child



New Life Radio is busy preparing for its annual Christmas broadcasts in two languages to desperate nations at war

Working quietly amidst the daily challenges of war and ongoing bombing attacks in Odessa, our broadcast team is diligently working on a series of radio programs that look at the plan of God and the means of our salvation, culminating in the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem.



There is such a rich background of Scriptural descriptions from the Old Testament to the annals of the New that reveal how God made all things possible for us to know about and believe in His Son. For a skeptical Slavic world, especially one steeped in a sacramental religious view that places less importance on personally knowing God's Word, NLR staff have the challenge to produce a variety of materials during the month of December that will culminate in a Christmas Day broadcast that can give every listener a full and comprehensive understanding of the day they are celebrating. And now for Ukraine (by government decree), the official date for Christmas is December 25th, joining the western world in celebration, while Russia continues with its old calendar January 7th observance.

This is a lot of work, and while NLR does this every year, in 2024 we have an unusual staffing situation to cover these responsibilities. NLR's station manager Ivan will coordinate programming from Linz, Austria, while studio manager Yuri in Odessa schedules recordings from part time producers living in Odessa, Romania, and Germany. Most of these are former NLR staffers who emigrated before or after the war started, yet felt a calling to contact us to offer their services. With three full time and seven part time contributors, we hope to be able to meet all the challenges in December to make this the best Christmas broadcast ever—for each of our language networks (*New Life Radio*—Russian; and *Radio Nove Zhitya*—Ukrainian).

CRFRU visits Odessa:

an update on our operations

NLR studios on the top floor of the Christian University in Odessa (CEHU)



NLR had pressing issues as the fall season started, to which CRFRU staff came to deal with in October and November. Our radio network works in a 194 year old building with antiquated infrastructure, renting from a university that has effectively been shut down since the war started. CEHU is in a difficult position to maintain the facilities and has few funds to cover their utilities. The building is without gas heat, though NLR heats with our air conditioners and has been doing so throughout the entire war.

Our goal was to do whatever is required to ensure our studios have heat and electric so our staff can work in reason-able conditions. Despite daily electric power shutoffs in the city, NLR's backup batteries are keeping them on the air and warm! Please pray for God's guidance as we deal with this issue of whether NLR can remain in the building, and how to proceed during this time of war if we have to find a new facility.

While in Odessa, Dan and Oksana Johnson spent their time working with staff on programming, intensive Bible studies, and other areas where staff need to be trained and on the same page. They visited local churches scouting for people called to ministry and trust that God will place more workers for His harvest at NLR as this war ends. We are amazed at how the Lord keeps things going for NLR as they provide Russia and Ukraine with outstanding Biblical instruction and music!

Part time staff highlight: Kyrill, Mikhail, and Daria

The history of NLR has been the story of a constant stream of servants coming and going, and CRFRU always looking for those called to ministry.

Kyrill Berezikov, who is now in Germany, joined us in summer 2022 during a tough time when we weren't sure if Odessa would be invaded or not, and Yuri was alone at the station. He contributed excellent programs on theology and apologetics, but eventually left in order to take his ailing mother to Germany for cancer treatments. He soon married and decided to remain, but Kyrill continued listening to NLR and felt a need to contribute. In summer 2024, he began producing a few programs each week and will continue on as he is able.

Mikhail is a seminary grad who was working with youth at a downtown church when we first met him. He accepted full time service at NLR in December 2021. Mikhail and Ivan Zhurakovski excelled at live radio Bible studies and his knowledge of theology was impressive. However, when the war broke out, Mikhail returned to serving at his church and even-

tually headed to Romania where he continues his theological education. This summer he approached NLR and again expressed his desire to contribute, so today he does weekly programs for us in Ukrainian on RNZ.



Daria Yanchishina is our newest addition to RNZ. Attending the same Baptist church as Yuri and Olga, Daria has a heart for ministry and desire to be used of the Lord and feels NLR might be a good fit for her. She is trained as a jeweler. Daria is active in her church with Bible studies and youth ministry.
